The agency accomplishes its mission and vision by providing in-depth programs and services that are proven to help these young women realize their potential and break free from an often ensnaring cycle of poverty.

We are honored to be recognized for our work empowering teen mothers and their children," stated Rachel Branaman, Executive Director of Alley's House. "Encouragement, positive influences, and support systems are missing from many of our moms' homes. For the past 17 years, Alley's House has provided guidance and support to more than 900 young women through its mission to empower them and their children to achieve independence through case management, education, and mentorship. Alley's House clients range in age from 13 to 21 and the agency anticipates serving 150 young moms and their children in 2014.
